Agency Officials Required to File a Personal Financial Statement Personal Financial Statement due April 30, 2024

Your 2024 personal financial statement (Form PFS) is due no later than **April 30, 2024**. This report must cover the calendar year ending December 31, 2023. You are receiving this notice because our records indicate you are required to file this report. If you think you received this notice in error, you should contact our office immediately.

A PFS filed with the TEC by an individual appointed to office may be filed electronically using the online filing application (located at www.ethics.state.tx.us/file) or on a paper Form PFS (located at www.ethics.state.tx.us/forms/pfs/pfsfrm-TEC.php). A PFS filed on paper must be signed and notarized. If you file electronically, neither your signature nor a notary is required.

When you log into the filing application, remember to use the "Select Filer Type" pull-down menu to select "PFS-(PFS)-Personal Financial Statement/State Officer" at the top of the pull-down list:



If this is your first time filing your PFS report with the TEC filing application:

- (1) View the instructional videos at www.ethics.state.tx.us/filinginfo/pfs/, and
- (2) Submit Form SECURITY-PFS to establish a primary email address and receive a password setup link. *You must submit a new Form SECURITY-PFS to file a PFS even if you previously submitted Form SECURITY-CF to file campaign finance reports.* Form SECURITY-PFS can be found on our website at *www.ethics.state.tx.us/data/forms/security/security-pfs.pdf.* Your completed form may be emailed to formsecurity@ethics.state.tx.us, mailed to the Texas Ethics Commission, P.O. Box 12070, Austin, TX 78701-2070, or hand-delivered to 201 E. 14th St., Sam Houston Building, 10th Floor, Austin, Texas 78701.
- (3) After you submit your completed Form SECURITY-PFS, watch your email in-box. TEC will send an email to your primary email address with your Filer ID, Filer Type, and a link to set up your password

and security questions and answers. *Note:* Your password must contain one special character (special characters include !@#\$%^&*), and one lowercase letter, and must be at least eight characters long. If you forget your password, you will be required to answer all security questions exactly to reset your password. When setting up your security answers, remember that your entry will not be case-sensitive, but spacing and punctuation matter.

Filing Deadline: For a PFS to be timely filed, a PFS filed *electronically* must be filed by midnight, Central Time Zone, on the night of the filing deadline. A PFS filed on paper must be either placed in the U.S. Post Office or in the hands of a common or contract carrier properly addressed with postage and handling charges prepaid or hand-delivered to the Ethics Commission's office on or before 5:00 p.m. on April 30, 2024.

Late Filing Penalties: Under the laws and rules enforced by the Texas Ethics Commission, the minimum civil penalty for filing a late PFS is \$500, but may increase up to \$10,000 if the report is filed more than 30 days late. Additional criminal penalties may apply. If you fail to file the PFS, our office may file a sworn complaint of the violation with the appropriate prosecuting attorney.

Extension Requests: Beginning March 1, you may request an extension to the April 30th filing deadline. The deadline for filing your extension request is April 30th. To request an extension, you will need to log into the PFS filing application, verify your profile information, then select "Manage My Reports." Click on "Apply for Extension." You will then see a message on your screen that your extension request has been granted. You will also receive an email at your primary email address on file stating that your extension request has been granted. Once your extension is granted, your new filing deadline will be July 1, 2024, deadline extended due to weekend.

Holdovers: An appointed officer who resigns or whose term of office expires AND who ceases to participate in agency functions is not required to file the personal financial statement that is due because of service in that office after the resignation date or term expiration date. Therefore, if your term expired or you resigned before January 1, 2024, *AND* you ceased to participate in the functions of the agency, you may not be required to file future personal financial statements. If this situation applies to you, you must give written notice to the Governor's Office and to the Texas Ethics Commission. Notice to the Texas Ethics Commission can be given by filing Form PFS-PF (Participation Form). This form can www.ethics.state.tx.us/data/forms/pfs/pfs_PF.pdf. Your completed Form PFS-PF may be emailed to affidavits@ethics.state.tx.us, mailed to the Texas Ethics Commission, P.O. Box 12070, Austin, TX 78701-2070, or hand-delivered to 201 E. 14th St., Sam Houston Building, 10th Floor, Austin, Texas 78701. Notice must be received before the filing deadline.
