Reports Due Before the May 28, 2024, Primary Runoff Election

This notice only applies to candidates and committees that are involved in the primary runoff election

May 20, 2024: Runoff Report must be received by May 20.

May 19, 2024 to May 27, 2024 at noon: Period for filing Daily Pre-Election Reports.

May 20, 2024: Runoff Report. Candidates in the primary runoff election must file a runoff report due eight days before the election. This runoff report <u>must be received</u> by the Texas Ethics Commission (TEC) by May 20. All political committees that accept political contributions or make political expenditures and/or have other activity in connection with the election are also required to file this runoff report. The first day covered by the report is February 25. The last day covered by the report is May 18.

May 19 – May 27, 2024: Daily Pre-Election Report(s) For Contributions. The period for filing a daily preelection report begins on May 19 and ends at noon on May 27. A filer may be required to file more than one daily pre-election report.

- **Candidates and Specific-Purpose Committees:** A candidate or specific-purpose committee that is involved in the primary runoff election and accepts political contributions from a single source that total more than \$2,150 during the reporting period must file the daily pre-election report. A daily pre-election report *must be received* by the TEC by the first business day after the date of the contribution that causes the total amount accepted from a contributor during the period to exceed \$2,150.
- General-Purpose Committees: A general-purpose committee must file a daily pre-election report if the committee is involved in the primary runoff election and if the committee accepts political contributions from a person that total more than \$7,350 during the reporting period, or makes direct campaign expenditures supporting or opposing either a single candidate that total more than \$2,150 or a group of candidates that total more than \$32,280 during the reporting period. A daily pre-election report <u>must be</u> <u>received</u> by the TEC by the first business day after the date the contribution is accepted or the expenditure is made that causes the total amount to exceed the applicable threshold.

Further Information

Persons filing campaign finance reports with the TEC are required to file those reports electronically unless the person falls within the statutory exemption. *Electronic reports must be filed by midnight, Central Time Zone, on the night of the filing deadline.* Please refer to "Filing A Report" on our website for further information on electronic filing.
