The laws placed under the TEC's jurisdiction seek to fulfil that mission by enabling voters to make informed decisions in the political process—decisions based in part on knowing the sources of financial support for candidates, the identity and activities of those who communicate directly with public officials for the purpose of influencing government action, and the financial interests of state officers.

Introduction

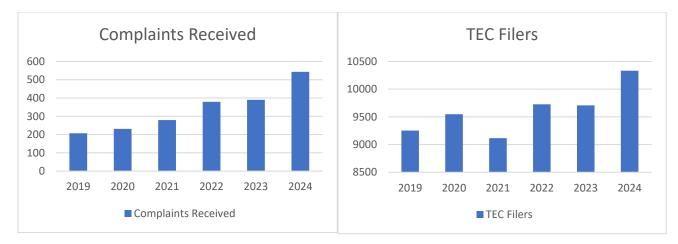
The TEC's Workload Continues to Grow

The TEC's workload continues to grow across all divisions and functions. Most significantly, the TEC has received 543 complaints in FY 2024, up 40% from the previous record of 390 set in FY 2023. FY 2024 also set records for the number of TEC filers $(10,332)^1$ and calls received by the TEC's legal helpline (7,045).

Over the past biennium, the TEC issued 33 advisory opinions, up 73% from the previous biennium and over 300% from the biennium before that. The TEC sent 181,552 filing notices to filers, up 30% from the previous biennium.² And the TEC processed 2,832 of requests to waive or reduce statutory penalties for late-filed reports, up 129% from the previous biennium.

The TEC is Focused on Improving its Filing System and Website

The TEC has been prioritizing the improvement of its filing system and website. In 2022, the TEC moved its filing system to a cloud-hosted environment. The upgrade reduced processing times for the TEC's largest filers by over 95%.

The TEC has also been improving the filing system by automating more of the work previously performed by TEC staff, including: (1) the redaction of statutorily-protected information from filings; (2) the calculation of statutory penalties for late-filed reports; (3) the submission and processing of requests to waive penalties; (4) management of the TEC's delinquent filer list; and (5) tracking referrals of unpaid penalties to the OAG. And the TEC is also adding new features to the system, including: (1) automatic email notices to filers who miss deadlines; (2) streamlined account management and treasure appointments; and (3) the ability to pay penalties online.

Finally, the TEC is also working with a vendor to redesign the TEC's website. The new website will have a cleaner user experience, easier-to-find legal guidance, and more robust options for searching and visualizing campaign finance data.

The TEC Continues to Face Costly Litigation

The TEC continues to face several lawsuits and appeals challenging the constitutionality of state law. After the Office of Attorney General ("OAG") declined or withdrew from representing the TEC in several of these matters, the TEC hired outside counsel in those lawsuits and in subsequent lawsuits asserting the same or similar legal arguments. These lawsuits seek to invalidate laws under the TEC's enforcement jurisdiction, the TEC's enabling statute, and over thirty years of the TEC's findings.

Exceptional Items

1) Adjust Exempt Positions

The TEC's unsalaried commissioners meet just once a quarter, so it must have experienced and knowledgeable staff to administer the TEC's day-to-day operations and provide clear and accurate guidance to the commissioners. The TEC's two exempt positions— Executive Director and General Counsel—are both appointed by, and report to, the commissioners.

a. <u>Reclassify the Executive Director to Group 5 with a Salary of \$190,000 (\$37,396 per year)</u>

The TEC's executive director is currently classified in Group 4, but given the position's combination of legal, managerial, and administrative responsibilities, it should be moved to Group 5. Comparable positions in Groups 5 and 6 include: (i) Chief Administrative Law Judge; (ii) Executive Director of the Department of Licensing and Regulation, (iii) Executive Director of the Texas Medical Board, (iv) Executive Director of the Texas Board of Nursing, and (v) Securities Commissioner. The requested salary would place the TEC's executive director close to the SAO midpoint for a Director VII and below the midpoint for a Deputy Director I.

The TEC's executive director has unique statutory responsibilities that require specialized legal knowledge. Chief among them is the duty to accept or reject jurisdiction over each complaint filed with the TEC. *See* Tex. Gov't Code § 571.124(c). If the executive director accepts a complaint, TEC enforcement staff must begin a formal investigation. *Id.* at § 571.124(e). Conversely, if the executive director rejects a complaint, it is immediately dismissed. *Id.* at § 571.124(f). Making the decision to accept or reject a complaint requires knowledge of the laws under the TEC's jurisdiction and relevant judicial decisions, and can have important legal, political, and financial consequences. When jurisdiction is accepted, complainants often publicize the investigation for political gain, and respondents can initiate costly litigation against the state. Having a qualified lawyer in this position is essential because state law mandates the decision to be made within five days of receiving a complaint and without the benefit of legal briefing from the respondent or input from the TEC's governing board. *Id.* at § 571.122(d).

Similarly, the TEC's governing board has delegated to the executive director the authority to offer speedy and confidential resolutions of complaints determined to allege "technical or de minimis" violations. 1 Tex. Admin. Code § 12.81(c)-(d). Making this determination not only requires a knowledge of the laws under the TEC's jurisdiction, but also the judgment to determine whether a violation "substantially" affects disclosure. *Id.* at 12.81(a)-(b). If the executive director determines that an alleged violation is technical

or de minimis, then he or she may immediately resolve a complaint through an agreed, confidential resolution. Otherwise, a complaint must be resolved by vote of the commissioners.

The TEC's executive director is also responsible for managing and improving the day-to-day operational effectiveness and efficiency of an agency with a large regulated community. The laws under the TEC's jurisdiction affect every government official and employee in Texas, every candidate for state or local office, and every private citizen who spends money to benefit a candidate, party, or measure. And the purpose of those laws is to provide all Texans with the information they need to make informed choices at the ballot box.

Performing the TEC's work requires a staff of specialized lawyers and computer programmers, because the TEC is responsible for: (i) providing clear and timely legal guidance, (ii) investigating alleged violations of the laws under its jurisdiction, and (iii) developing, maintaining, and improving an electronic filing system and web-based disclosure portal. This results in significant salary compression between the agency's staff and leadership. For example, the TEC's executive director's current salary is below the midpoint for an Attorney V, Director V, and Cybersecurity Officer. And it is below the maximum for an Attorney IV, Director III, and Programmer V.

b. Adjust the General Counsel's Salary to \$175,000 (\$31,000 per year)

The TEC's general counsel plays a meaningful role in the agency's policymaking because he or she is relied upon by the agency's unsalaried commissioners to advise them on the resolution of every complaint, request for advisory opinion, and exercise of rulemaking authority. He or she drafts every opinion, is expected to help drive the TEC's agenda for rulemaking, provides guidance on the proper resolution of every complaint, and manages the TEC's outside litigation, which often involves challenges to the constitutionality of state law. For these reasons, the TEC's general counsel must have highly specialized knowledge of the laws under the agency's jurisdiction and the relevant judicial precedents construing individuals' constitutional rights to participate in political and electoral processes.

Moreover, an effective general counsel of the TEC must also understand how to build bipartisan consensus on an important and controversial area of the law. The TEC's governing board has a constitutionally-guaranteed bipartisan split of four Republicans and four Democrats, and many of the agency's actions, such as finding a violation or issuing a new rule, require a supermajority vote of six out the eight commissioners. Consequently, the general counsel must understand not only how to analyze the law, but also how to craft and advocate for positions that will gain bipartisan support.

The TEC's general counsel must also manage a division of employees responsible for carrying out several of the agency's most important functions, including delivering clear legal guidance to the agency's regulated community and considering filers' requests to

waive or reduce civil penalties. Among other things, it is the general counsel's responsibility to manage a responsive on-demand legal helpline.

Finally, the TEC's general counsel serves as the TEC's deputy director. He or she assists the executive director with the TEC's day-today operations and serves as the executive director in the executive director's absence.

The requested salary of \$175,000 per year would place the TEC's general counsel between the SAO midpoints for a General Counsel III and General Counsel IV and below the midpoint for a Deputy Director I.

2) Additional Full Time Employees

After having its FTE cap cut by six last biennium, the TEC is requesting the return of 5.6 FTEs. The TEC currently fully staffed with one part-time employee and exceeds its cap by 0.4 employees. It is seeking to add the following five positions and convert its only part-time position to full time. The requested salaries are near the SAO midpoints for their classification and would be equitable to the TEC's current salaries.

i. Project Manager IV (\$110,000 per year)

The TEC's most important function is to develop, maintain, and enhance an electronic filing system and a web-based portal for the public to access disclosure data. That function requires significant coordination with—and oversight of—the TEC's technology vendors. The TEC is requesting the funding and authority to hire an experienced project manager to ensure that the Legislature's investments in the TEC's technology are spent efficiently and that the TEC's technology vendors deliver results on time and on budget. This employee will support the corrective actions taken in connection with the SAO's recent audit of the TEC.³

ii. Attorney III, Enforcement (\$110,000 per year)

The TEC is requesting one additional attorney for its Enforcement Division because it has received an unprecedented number of sworn complaints in recent years. After setting a record of 390 complaints received in fiscal year 2023, the TEC has already received more than 540 in fiscal year 2024. Current attorney caseload is more than three times higher than in 2020 or 2021, and is more than twice

the TEC's average between 2019-2023.⁴ The agency needs at least one more mid-level attorney to manage the increased workload and meet the various statutory deadlines related to processing complaints.

iii. Attorney III, Office of General Counsel (\$110,000 per year)

The TEC is also requesting an additional attorney for its Office of General Counsel. This division is responsible for drafting TEC advisory opinions and rules, advising the commissioners on the resolution of every enforcement action, ensuring the TEC's compliance with applicable contracting and employment laws and regulations, and providing clear and timely legal guidance to the TEC's regulated community, including by offering a responsive legal helpline that received over 7,000 calls for assistance last year. Currently, this division has only three attorneys, including the general counsel. One additional attorney would help with all of the division's functions, including the TEC's ongoing efforts to review and revise its administrative rules pursuant to Section 2001.039 of the Government Code.

iv. Customer Service Representative III (\$50,000 per year)

After having its FTE cap cut last biennium, the TEC opted to forego a human receptionist in favor of hiring more budgetary expertise. The TEC wants to return to answering live calls rather than relying on voice or email messages from the public. Since the TEC is a small agency, eliminating a front desk receptionist resulted in the administrative staff having to assume those duties in addition to their primary responsibilities.⁵ Consequently, the TEC is requesting funding and authorization to hire a mid-level customer service representative that is capable not only of answering and routing phone calls and visitors, but also reviewing and routing mail and other written correspondence, entering information into databases, researching information to solve customer service problems, and performing other general clerical services.

v. Information Technology Support Specialist III (\$60,000 per year)

Finally, the TEC is requesting a dedicated IT support specialist. Each year the TEC responds to thousands of requests for technical assistance. These requests are currently handled by the TEC's programmers and systems administrator. A dedicated IT support specialist will result not only in better customer service, but also more time for the agency's programming and technical staff to focus on their primary responsibilities.

vi. Convert the TEC's sole auditor to a full-time position (\$20,000 per year)

Currently, the TEC employs only one part-time auditor to perform the statutory duties outlined in Texas Government Code section 571.069. The TEC employs this auditor as a 0.8 FTE, resulting FTE cap exceedance of 0.4.⁶ The TEC is requesting the authority and funding to convert this position to full time.

3) Legal Representation

The TEC is requesting a package of cost-neutral changes related to the funding and authority to defend itself against lawsuits challenging the constitutionality of laws placed under its jurisdiction.

a. <u>Clarify that the TEC, as a Constitutionally Established Agency, Has the Authority to Use Appropriations on Legal</u> <u>Counsel Without OAG Approval</u>

The TEC, its commissioners, and its executive director are sometimes named defendants in lawsuits asserting constitutional challenges to the laws under its jurisdiction. These lawsuits often bring "facial" challenges to laws that the TEC has taken no action to enforce against the plaintiff. Some seek to invalidate the TEC's enabling statute and over thirty years of the TEC's orders. Pending examples include:

- A constitutional challenge to the Texas lobby law and the TEC's enabling statute pending in the Texas Supreme Court;
- A constitutional challenge to the law prohibiting corporate contributions pending in the Western District of Texas; and
- A constitutional challenge to a political advertising disclosure law and the TEC's enabling statute pending in the Western District of Texas.

After the Office of Attorney General ("OAG") declined or withdrew from defending certain laws under the TEC's jurisdiction, the TEC has received legislative appropriations for several biennia to pay for outside litigation counsel. However, the TEC's authority to use these appropriations without obtaining the OAG's approval is unclear.

On the one hand, the Government Code expressly authorizes constitutionally-established agencies like the TEC to contract for legal services without the approval of the OAG. Tex. Gov't Code § 402.0212 ("a contract for legal services between an attorney ... and a state agency in the executive department, **other than an agency established by the Texas Constitution**, must be approved by the

attorney general to be valid.") (emphasis added). On the other hand, Article IX, Section 16.01 of the General Appropriations Act ("GAA") prohibits agencies—unless specifically exempted—from using appropriations to pay for legal services without the consent of the OAG. *See* § 16.01(b) (prohibiting agencies from using appropriations to defend themselves against legal actions without OAG approval); § 16.01(i) (exempting certain agencies).

In short, the TEC has the legal authority to enter into a contract without OAG approval, but not to pay for the services rendered under such a contract. In practice, the appropriations rider undermines the authorization provided by the Government Code.

Consequently, the TEC is requesting to be added to the list of agencies exempted from Article IX, Section 16.01(a)-(h) of the GAA. The OAG's approval process has, at times, taken too long and put the TEC at a procedural disadvantage. In one pending federal lawsuit, the OAG has not answered the TEC's request to hire outside counsel nearly three months after the suit was filed.

b. Provide UB Authority for the TEC's Litigation Budget

Litigation expenses are unpredictable and irregular on a year-to-year basis, so the TEC is requesting unexpended-balance ("UB") flexibility for its litigation budget. Rather than appropriations in each year, the TEC is requesting a lump-sum appropriation in year one of the biennium with UB authority to the second year of the biennium. This will better allow the TEC to cover more expensive stages of litigation—such as trials and fact discovery—when they occur. The TEC thus requests the following rider:

Unexpended Balance Authority for Legal Services. Any unobligated and unexpended balances as of August 31, 2026 out of appropriations made to the Texas Ethics Commission for legal services in strategy A.1.3, Enforcement are appropriated for the same purpose for the fiscal year beginning September 1, 2025.

c. <u>Re-introduce a Rider Regarding the TEC's Litigation Budget</u>

The TEC's appropriations for legal services originally came with a rider, but it was removed in 2017. However, because of the uncertainties of litigation costs and the ongoing importance of maintaining the appropriation, the TEC has not spent these funds for any purpose other than outside counsel. This practice—combined with the inherent unpredictability of litigation costs—has often resulted in lapses, which could raise questions about the necessity of ongoing funding. To answer those questions, the TEC is recommending the following rider:

Legal Services. Included in amounts appropriated above in Strategy A.1.3, Enforcement, is \$300,000 in General Revenue in each fiscal year of the biennium to the Texas Ethics Commission for legal services related to the enforcement or defense of laws under the Commission's jurisdiction.

4) Lump Sum Payments to Retiring Employees (\$206,806 for biennium)

The TEC is required to pay retiring employees a lump sum for unused annual leave. Nine of the TEC's current employees are eligible for retirement in FY 2026 and an additional one will become eligible in FY 2027. Combined, this represents nearly one third of the current workforce, and they wil be owed a maximum total payout of \$206,806 in lump sum entitlements upon their retirement. Many of these employees occupy senior positions within the agency.

5) Electronic Filing System Improvements (\$137,500 per year)

The TEC lapsed a portion of this appropriation last biennium as it exhausted its existing balance of pre-purchased labor from its vendor. The TEC purchased no additional labor in FY 2023 or FY 2024 and used over 7,300 hours from its accrued balance on several important enhancements, including, but not limited to: (1) the migration to a cloud-hosted environment, (2) statutorily-mandated changes to reporting political expenditures made by credit card, and (3) the automatic redaction of statutorily-protected information from personal financial statements.

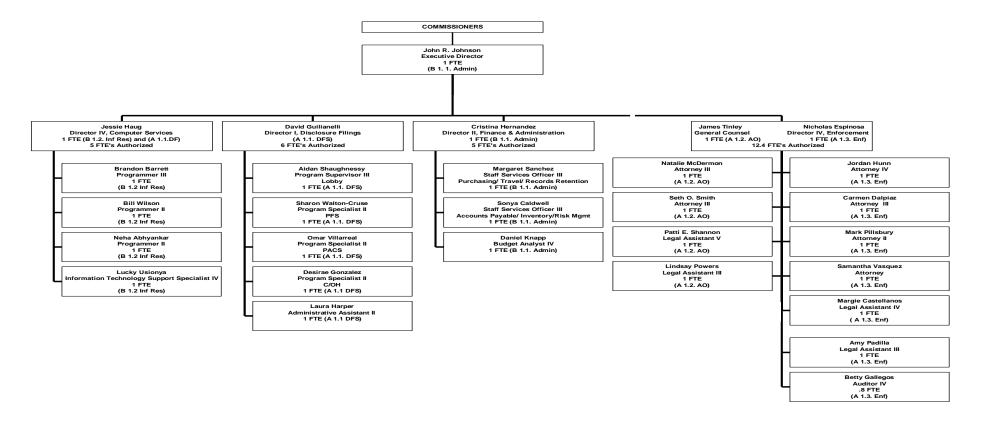
The TEC has approximately 1,200 hours of pre-purchased labor remaining and additional funding for enhancements in FY 2025 that will be used to continue work on the following projects: (1) automatic calculation of statutory penalties for late-filed reports; (2) online submission of requests to waive penalties; (3) automated management of the TEC's delinquent filer list; (4) online penalty payment; and (5) automated tracking of referrals to the OAG. These enhancements will make the TEC more efficient by automating much of the work that is currently done by TEC employees. It will also improve the user experience for filers by moving more TEC operations—such as treasurer appointments and waiver requests—to within the filing system itself.

However, funding is needed for the coming biennium to continue improving the filing system and accommodate statutory changes. If awarded, the TEC intends to use these funds to complete the projects identified above and make the following additional enhancements in the FY 26/27 biennium: (1) continued automation and electronic transmission of late-filing notices; (2) a modernized approach to account management, including the ability to file and amend treasurer appointments online; and (3) revisions to the personal financial statement reporting forms.

Conclusion

The TEC greatly appreciates the Legislature's continued support and respectfully requests the above-identified exceptional items.

The OGC's other functions include promoting voluntary compliance with the law by providing educational resources and outreach to filers and the general public, assisting the Office of the Attorney General or outside legal counsel in civil actions brought by or against the TEC, serving as the agency's liaison to governmental agencies, the media, law enforcement, and the Legislature, and assuring the TEC's compliance with EEO/AA, ADA, and agency safety and ethics requirements.

Advisory opinion requests are initiated by individuals subject to the laws administered by the Commission and are resolved by the Commission in open meetings. Accordingly, the Commission has no control over the number of requests received.

STRATEGY DESCRIPTION AND JUSTIFICATION:

The Enforcement Division investigates alleged violations of the law, recommends to the Commission appropriate action to take with respect to apparent violations, and negotiates agreed resolutions with respondents or their counsel. If an enforcement matter does not resolve through agreement, the complaint proceeds to a formal hearing at which the respondent has the opportunity to present evidence and legal argument. Respondents who wish to challenge the decision of the Commission have the right to file a de novo appeal in Travis County District Court. The TEC also automatically assesses statutory penalties to candidates, officials, and lobbyists who fail to file required reports on time. Texas law and the Commission's rules provide a legal process for appealing those penalties, and the Enforcement Division is responsible for processing those appeals. Finally, the Enforcement Division also conducts randomized audits of reports filed with the Commission, as directed by state law. If any issues are discovered during this process, the Enforcement Division provides guidance to filers for corrective actions.

Any person may file a sworn complaint. The Commission has no control over the number of sworn complaints it receives or the violations alleged in those complaints. Once a sworn complaint has been filed, the respondent named in the complaint is entitled to two separate hearings, the last one may be before the Commission or an administrative law judge. The time needed to reach a final resolution is largely outside the control of the Commission.

Federal law has little direct influence on agency functions because federal laws apply to different persons than those regulated by the Commission. However, federal court rulings, such as the U. S. Supreme Court decision in Citizens United v. Federal Election Commission, may have an effect on the laws administered and enforced by the Commission. Similarly, federal lawsuits challenging the constitutionality of the laws enforced by the Commission may have an effect on the laws administered and enforced by the Commission.

After having its FTE cap cut by six last biennium, the TEC is requesting the return of 5.6 FTEs. Restoring the 5.6 FTEs would allow the TEC to address its growing workload, comply with SAO audit findings, and most efficiently serve the public. Additionally, the TEC currently exceeds its FTE cap by 0.4 at full employment.

All requested salaries are near the SAO midpoints for their classification.

(a)1.0 Project Manager III to coordinate with the TEC's outside vendor maintaining, developing, and improving the agency's electronic filing system. This request includes \$220,000 in salary funding and \$8,524 in other operating expenses over the biennium in Strategy B.1.2.

(b)1.0 Attorney III to address a growing number of sworn complaints and to ensure compliance with statutory deadlines. This request includes \$220,000 in salary funding and \$10,448 in other operating expenses over the biennium in Strategy A.1.3.

(c)1.0 Attorney III to ensure compliance with all applicable laws and regulations and to assist in updating the administrative rules. This request includes \$220,000 in salary funding and \$10,448 in other operating expenses over the biennium in Strategy A.1.2.

EXTERNAL/INTERNAL FACTORS:

As the TEC's workload continues to grow it is important that the agency has sufficient staff to meet statutory deadlines as well as continue to efficiently serve the public. TEC has seen significant growth across all strategies and programs.

TEC has received 543 complaints in FY 2024, up 40% from the previous record of 390 set in FY 2023. FY 2024 also set a record for the number of TEC filers (10,332), up 12% from 2019, and calls received by the TEC's legal helpline (7,045), up 62% from 2020.

From the 2020-2021 biennium to the 2022-23 biennium, the TEC issued 33 advisory opinions, up 73% from the previous biennium and over 300% from the biennium before that. The TEC sent 181,552 filing notices to filers, up 30% from the previous biennium. And the TEC processed 2,832 of requests to waive or reduce statutory penalties for late-filed reports, up 129% from the previous biennium.

The TEC is required to pay retiring employees a lump sum for unused annual leave. Nine of the Commission's current employees are eligible for retirement in fiscal year 2026 and an additional one will become eligible in fiscal year 2027. Combined, this represents nearly one-third of the current workforce, and they will be owed a maximum total payment of \$206,806 in lump sum entitlements upon their retirement. The agency is requesting \$137,500 in both FY 2026 and in FY2027 to fund enhancements to the electronic filing system. The filing system is fully managed by the vendor that developed the software, and this vendor must make the code changes to the system. Enhancements to the filing system are not covered under the maintenance contract with the vendor. Enhancement work is billed as time and materials at \$150/hour.

IS THIS IT COMPONENT RELATED TO A NEW OR CURRENT PROJECT?

CURRENT

STATUS:

Currently the legislature has appropriated funds in the budget baseline for maintenance of the filing system. This funding does not include dollars for enhancements to the campaign finance, lobby, or personal financial statement filing applications, and the Filing Application Manager. Every legislative session unfunded mandates affecting the campaign finance, personal financial statement, and/or the lobby filing application are passed. The affected filing application must be enhanced, typically requiring several hundred hours of labor to implement the required changes to the source code. The Commission anticipates there will be source code modifications required to implement legislative changes passed during the 89th Legislative Session. In addition, there are several enhancements to the campaign finance application, lobby filing application Manager that the Commission desires to implement if funding is awarded, including automating the first administrative late letter sent to a filer 10 days after a filer misses a filing deadline, reformatting the investment parts of the PFS report to better align with modern investment strategies and IRS reporting, automatically close out PAC filers when the PAC files a final report, and migrate the TEC bulk email processes to the filing system so that outgoing bulk emails can be systematically logged into the database.

OUTCOMES:

Enhancements to the Commission's filing applications enable the Commission's filers to comply with the State of Texas laws and regulations related to those filing requirements. Enhancements can improve the function, usability, and performance of the filing applications, thus enabling filers to enjoy a good filing experience while meeting legal requirements of filing. Enhancements result in cost efficiencies when they automate manual staff tasks that are data entry error prone, thereby greatly increasing the speed at the task is performed and complete as well as eliminating human data entry errors.

OUTPUTS:

Enhancements to the filing applications better enable filers to disclose what is required to be disclosed by law. Data entry steps that may be difficult to understand may be simplified for easier data entry by the filers, resulting in less calls for IT or legal consultation for that section of the form. Enhancements that can automate staff's repetitive tasks will free up staff members to work on other pressing matters.

ALTERNATIVE ANALYSIS

The TEC electronic filing system is fully vendor managed. If the project is not funded or is only funded in part, the Commission may not be able to make enhancements to the code as required by legislative mandates, or to satisfy changing business rules set by new Commission rules, or as requested by our staff and filers for ease of use. If the Commission is not able to make enhancements as required by legislative mandate, the state runs the risk of filed reports not being compliant with the law.

DESCRIPTION OF ANTICIPATED OUT-YEAR COSTS :

In order to implement any present and future legislative, Commission, and public requested enhancements to the electronic filing system and the 1295 filing application, the Commission would need to contract with the vendor for service by the hour. The vendor's hourly time and materials rate is \$150/hour for FY2024-FY2025. This rate is not changing for FY2026-FY2027. However, technological challenges could increase the rate at 25% in future years. The Commission is anticipating some requested changes to take up to 500 hours to complete. The number of hours varies depending on the complexity of the requested enhancements. Funding to add new features to the electronic filing system will benefit the public and persons who use the system to file reports. As the system is used, a new set of user needs will surface that can be addressed by enhancing the system. Enhancements can be software and/or hardware based. As the TEC's workload continues to grow it is important that the agency has sufficient staff to meet statutory deadlines as well as continue to efficiently serve the public. TEC has seen significant growth across all strategies and programs.

TEC has received 543 complaints in FY 2024, up 40% from the previous record of 390 set in FY 2023. FY 2024 also set a record for the number of TEC filers (10,332), up 12% from 2019, and calls received by the TEC's legal helpline (7,045), up 62% from 2020.

From the 2020-2021 biennium to the 2022-23 biennium, the TEC issued 33 advisory opinions, up 73% from the previous biennium and over 300% from the biennium before that. The TEC sent 181,552 filing notices to filers, up 30% from the previous biennium. And the TEC processed 2,832 of requests to waive or reduce statutory penalties for late-filed reports, up 129% from the previous biennium.

IS THIS IT COMPONENT RELATED TO A NEW OR CURRENT PROJECT?

CURRENT

STATUS:

Currently the legislature has appropriated funds in the budget baseline for maintenance of the filing system. This funding does not include dollars for enhancements to the campaign finance, lobby, or personal financial statement filing applications, and the Filing Application Manager. Every legislative session unfunded mandates affecting the campaign finance, personal financial statement, and/or the lobby filing application are passed. The affected filing application must be enhanced, typically requiring several hundred hours of labor to implement the required changes to the source code. The Commission anticipates there will be source code modifications required to implement legislative changes passed during the 89th Legislative Session. In addition, there are several enhancements to the campaign finance application, lobby filing application Manager that the Commission desires to implement if funding is awarded, including automating the first administrative late letter sent to a filer 10 days after a filer misses a filing deadline, reformatting the investment parts of the PFS report to better align with modern investment strategies and IRS reporting, automatically close out PAC filers when the PAC files a final report, and migrate the TEC bulk email processes to the filing system so that outgoing bulk emails can be systematically logged into the database.

OUTCOMES:

Enhancements to the Commission's filing applications enable the Commission's filers to comply with the State of Texas laws and regulations related to those filing requirements. Enhancements can improve the function, usability, and performance of the filing applications, thus enabling filers to enjoy a good filing experience while meeting legal requirements of filing. Enhancements result in cost efficiencies when they automate manual staff tasks that are data entry error prone, thereby greatly increasing the speed at the task is performed and complete as well as eliminating human data entry errors.

OUTPUTS:

Enhancements to the filing applications better enable filers to disclose what is required to be disclosed by law. Data entry steps that may be difficult to understand may be simplified for easier data entry by the filers, resulting in less calls for IT or legal consultation for that section of the form. Enhancements that can automate staff's repetitive tasks will free up staff members to work on other pressing matters.

The TEC electronic filing system is fully vendor managed. If the Commission is not able to make enhancements as required by legislative mandate, the state runs the risk of filed reports not being compliant with the law.

The billing rate for FY2026 and FY2027 is \$150/hour, and this rate is expected to increase in future years. Ethics reform is typically a priority on legislative session agendas. New ethics related statutory changes are passed each session that require source code changes to the electronic filing system in order to satisfy the legal requirements of the new statutes. Due to the complex nature of the electronic filing system, the contracted software vendor must be employed to make enhancements to the source code, and these changes are billed hourly as time and materials. Enhancements to the electronic filing system will always be required due to legislative changes and Commission rule changes. Because the necessary code changes must be

outsourced, the Commission needs to continually fund these enhancement hours on an annual basis.

OPERATING COSTS DESCRIPTION AND JUSTIFICATION:

Several areas of the website have confusing user interfaces that could be improved. For example, it is not obvious to many of our callers how to view anything but the most recent report filed by an individual or committee. It is also difficult for at least some users to find certain information on our website, like, for example, the agency's legal guides. Working with an outside vendor to improve the basic usability of our website will provide the best value to the state, given the TEC's current diminished staffing levels and the high salaries required to recruit in-house programming expertise. The requested amount covers work by the vendor for enhancements to the electronic filing and disclosure database system in response to legislative changes and requests from filers. This includes any changes to the filing software or changes to campaign finance, lobby, or personal financial disclosure reports or Form 1295 certificates. The cost of vendor services for enhancements is not covered by the maintenance contract. Without the additional funding, changes to forms or the software in response to new laws or amendments to existing laws will not happen. This fiscal biennium, the enhancement hours were needed to move the TEC electronic filing system to the cloud, a necessary move to keep the system operational for which there was no additional funding. This took precedent over any other necessary enhancements, which now must be even more urgently done. Failure to authorize these enhancements will negatively impact Commission filers' ability to comply with their statutory obligations.

The commission's electronic filing system is used by approximately 9,000 statewide filers who annually file more than 33,000 campaign finance, lobby, and personal financial statements with the State of Texas, and approximately 37,000 active business and government entity filers who create and file more than 70,000 acknowledged Certificates of Interested Parties annually. Not only is the system required to be operational 24x7x365, very large reports require more CPU and memory resources for the filing and rendering processes. The filing system's AWS infrastructure is configured to allocate on-demand extensions for the short periods when extra compute resources are needed. In addition to using the AWS Web Application Firewall (WAF), several AWS cybersecurity programs are employed as safeguards for the system.
