MINUTES

This meeting was tape recorded. These minutes are a summary record of the commission's actions at the meeting. For a detailed record of discussions and statements made by persons speaking at the meeting, please consult the audio tapes on file at the Commission's office.

Agenda Item 1: Call to order; roll call.

The meeting was called to order by Chair Looney. David A. Reisman, Executive Director, called the roll. All commissioners were present, except Commissioner Hernandez.

Agenda Item 4: Communication to the commission from the public.

None.

Agenda Item 3: Comments by the executive director.

David A. Reisman, Executive Director, made the following comments:

- 1. Mr. Reisman introduced Cyndi Johnson, the new agency receptionist.
- 2. The financial management audit by the State Auditor's Office regarding the revenue and expenditures at the Texas Ethics Commission has been released. The report found that the revenues processed by the commission were recorded correctly and in a timely manner, and no errors were found in testing the commission's expenditures for salaries and wages, rentals and leases, and repairs and maintenance, which represent the majority of the commission's expenditures.

The report gave recommendations that will provide greater assurances that expenditures are for valid purposes and that record-keeping for accounting and revenues is accurate. Most of the recommendations have already been implemented within the timeframe provided in our response. Mr. Reisman expressed his

appreciation of the State Auditor's Office in accommodating the Ethics Commission's request for an audit of our financial systems.

- 3. As of July 14, 2006, 174 complaints have been filed with the commission. Mr. Reisman anticipates over 300 complaints being filed in 2006.
- 4. Monday, July 17, 2006, is the deadline for filing the July semiannual report for campaign finance.
- 5. In June 2006, the Ethics Commission released new campaign finance software which contains the latest changes in the commission's rules and laws. Half of the filings have already been received.
- 6. The warrant hold procedure has been implemented. Filers who do not pay their fines to the Ethics Commission in a timely fashion are referred to the Attorney General's Office for collection. If these filers are owed money from the state by the Comptroller, that money would then be directed to the Ethics Commission.
- 7. The first statewide online ethics training program that was developed in-house for executive branch employees has been released to better assist agencies in obtaining ethics training or supplementing the current ethics training given to employees by the agencies.

The Connecticut State Ethics Commission has inquired about our program as they were looking to create one of their own. The Ethics Commission plans to produce a similar online ethics training program for legislators and their staffs prior to the next legislative session.
