David A. Reisman, Executive Director, made the following comments:

- 1. Mr. Reisman announced that the meeting is being broadcast on the local capitol channel 39.

- 3. The staff testified at a joint budget hearing conducted by leadership staff on September 7, 2006. Staff gave a presentation and answered questions pertaining to the agency's legislative appropriations request.
- 4. Staff and Commissioner Fischer will be presenting the Legislative Appropriation Request to the Senate Finance Committee on September 26, 2006.
- 5. The facial compliance audit, required pursuant to Government Code § 571.069, was recently completed by the staff. A designated number of reports was pulled randomly from each filer type. The results show that of the 59 total reports audited, 29 filers (or 49 percent) had errors. We contacted those filers requesting corrections and responses.
- 6. Mr. Reisman reminded the commissioners to complete the Open Government Training provided by the Office of the Attorney General. Mr. Reisman informed the commissioners that he has sent out a CD providing that training or they can access the training by going onto the Office of the Attorney General's website.
