### MINUTES

#### Agenda Item 1: Call to order; roll call.

The meeting was called to order by Chair Davenport. David A. Reisman, Executive Director, called the roll. All commissioners were present, except Commissioner Graham and Commissioner Fischer who arrived later.

#### Agenda Item 2: Communication to the commission from the public.

### Agenda Item 3: Comments by the commissioners.

Commissioner Harrison briefed the commission regarding a letter to the editor of the American Statesman from a citizen from Dripping Springs. Chair Davenport announced this will be his last meeting as chair and introduced his family who were in attendance. Chair Davenport established a subcommittee consisting of David A. Reisman, Executive Director, Vice Chair Harrison, and Commissioners Fischer and Mendoza related to a request from some larger cities that want to work with the Ethics Commission on campaign finance electronic filing software for local filing authorities.

#### Agenda Item 4: Comments by the executive director.

David A. Reisman, Executive Director, made the following comments:

- 1. Mr. Reisman introduced Brad Johnson who filled the Attorney I position.
- 2. Mr. Reisman briefed the commission on the status of the motion to quash. On November 13, 2007, following the executive session of the commission, the commission in open session voted unanimously to file a motion to quash the subpoena duces tecum served on commission staff to release confidential sworn complaint documents. While the court directed that the details of the subpoena duces tecum be kept confidential, Mr. Reisman stated that the motion to quash filed by commission staff was granted.
- 3. Mr. Reisman reported that he, Natalia L. Ashley, Tim Sorrells, and Ian Steusloff have conducted statewide presentations and meetings to educate various interest groups and the public. Some of the conferences and presentations that staff have participated in include the PAAT Conference; Government, Law, and Liability Conference; Houston Community College; Texas Election and Campaign Law Institute Conference; and the Louisiana Advisory Board and Ethics Reform, which is undergoing a major ethics reform.
- 4. Included in the commissioners' packets was the quarterly report that summarizes some of the FTE's, the budget reporting, and performance data over this last quarter. The Director of Finance and Administration will be giving a presentation later on the agenda and will discuss our budget and operations information in more detail.
- 5. This calendar year, a total of 233 sworn complaints have been received. Eighteen sworn complaints have been received since the October 26, 2007, commission meeting.
- 6. Mr. Reisman thanked Chair Davenport for his services both as Vice Chair and Chair of the commission, his support of staff, his interest, and his communications with the commission. Election of the new chair will be voted on later on the agenda.
