MINUTES

Agenda Item 1: Call to order; roll call.

The meeting was called to order by Chair Fischer. David A. Reisman, Executive Director, called the roll. All Commissioners were present, except for Commissioner Montagne.

Agenda Item 2: Communication to the Commission from the public.

Jack Gullahorn, President, Professional Advocacy Association of Texas, spoke before the Commission regarding rulemaking and H.B. 3445.

Agenda Item 3: Comments by the Commissioners.

Chair Fischer welcomed the new commissioner, George H. "Trey" Henderson, III. Chair Fischer discussed legislation. He thanked Commission staff for their hard work during the legislative session. Chair Fischer commented on Commissioner Delco's appearance on the cover of the May 2009 edition of Austin Woman magazine.

Agenda Item 5: Approve minutes of the April 16, 2009, executive session and April 16, 2009, commission meeting.

Motion by Commissioner Harrison to adopt the April 16, 2009, executive session minutes and the April 16, 2009, commission meeting minutes; second by Commissioner Delco. Motion passed by a vote of seven ayes.

Agenda Item 4: Comments by the executive director.

David A. Reisman, Executive Director, made the following comments:

- 1. Mr. Reisman welcomed the new commissioner, Mr. Henderson from Lufkin, Texas.
- 2. Mr. Reisman stated that 160 sworn complaints have been filed so far this year. He discussed the report compiled listing the types and numbers of specific violations involving sworn complaints and what types of violations occurred most often. Mr. Reisman also stated that the Commission has posted information for filers on the Commission's website, including instructions, guides, brochures, and a video for candidates and officeholders on filing reports.
- 3. Mr. Reisman updated the Commission on the legislative bills passed. He discussed the budget bill, S.B. 1, and the effect on the Commission. Mr. Reisman also discussed the supplemental appropriations bill regarding payment for the attorneys' fees in the lawsuit. Fourteen bills were passed and a brief summary of each bill was included in the Commissioners' notebooks. Mr. Reisman mentioned that five legislative recommendations submitted by the Commission are included in these bills.
